

CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS FOR WOOD SURFACES

RAW MATERIAL

Wood is a product of nature; it grew for a long time before turned into furniture. Wood is therefore a precious material. We would like to insure it fulfils its function and looks beautiful for a long time.

VALUE PRESERVATION

The wood surface is protected with a coating. It belongs to the most resistant coatings used to protect furniture. This lacquer protects the wood from damages of water, grease etc. (DIN 68861, 1B and EN71).

Without this protective layer, the wood would be damaged within a very short time. But the coating can only fulfil its function if it is also properly handled.

CLEANING PRODUCTS

The coating layer should therefore never be cleaned with abrasive or polishing cleaning agents. These detergents act like abrasive paper, and in the long run will scrap the coating. The scratched paint surface is then subjected to the external damages.

Also sharp-edged table decoration objects and rough surfaces will destroy the coating and should be avoided.

Only mild detergents or liquid dishwashing detergents such as Palmolive, etc. should be used. Instructions of those detergents should be read.

Certain detergents contain alkaline components such as Ammonia (ammonia). Those will destroy the paint surfaces. These detergents are therefore to be avoided.

CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS

If a lacquered wooden surface is to be adorned by a protective coating. Surfaces are to be cleaned with a damp (Non-wet) cloth without scrubbing or polishing. They should then be dried with a dry cloth.

Surfaces should always be cleaned in a moist but not wet manner. Wetness in the wood pores must be avoided.

This applies in particular to open-pore wood species such as oak, ash, table tops (mainly in veneer) and non-upholstered parts such as seat and back for chairs.
